On Sunday evening (14/04), after screening a selection including the best non-fiction films produced in Brazil and around the world, the **It's All True 2019 - 24<sup>th</sup> International Documentary Film Festival** announced this year's winners.

Created and directed by the film critic Amir Labaki, this year's festival screened 66 films, free of charge, in São Paulo and Rio de Janeiro.

The jury for the Brazilian feature length and short-film competitions was made up of the documentary filmmakers Vladimir Carvalho ("O País de São Saruê") and Cristiano Burlan ("Mataram Meu Irmão"), along with the professor Sheila Schvarzman.

The international competition and Latin American competition films were assessed by the playwright and director Cordelia Dvorák, the North-American filmmaker Nicolas Rossier, and the director and screenwriter Paulo Mendonça.

In addition to the cash awards and festival trophies, the winning films in the Brazilian and international feature length and short-film competitions automatically qualify for consideration to compete for next year's Oscar awards.

It's All True was the first South-American festival to nominate films to compete for the awards presented by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.
